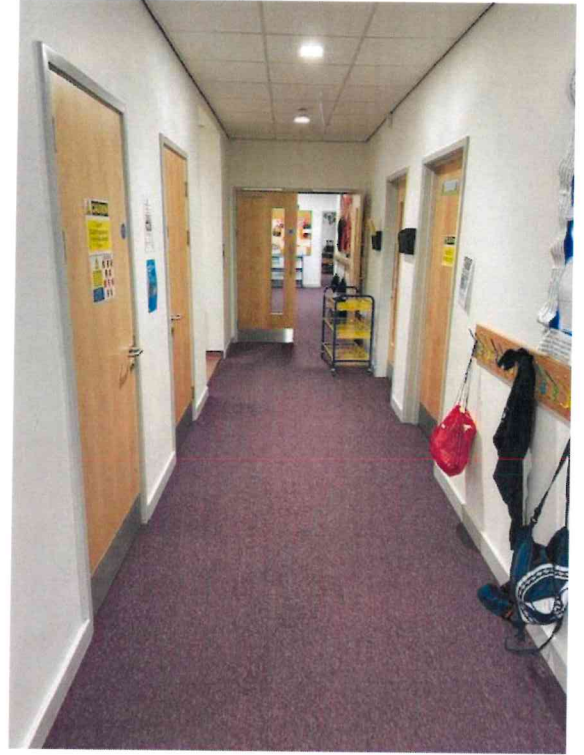

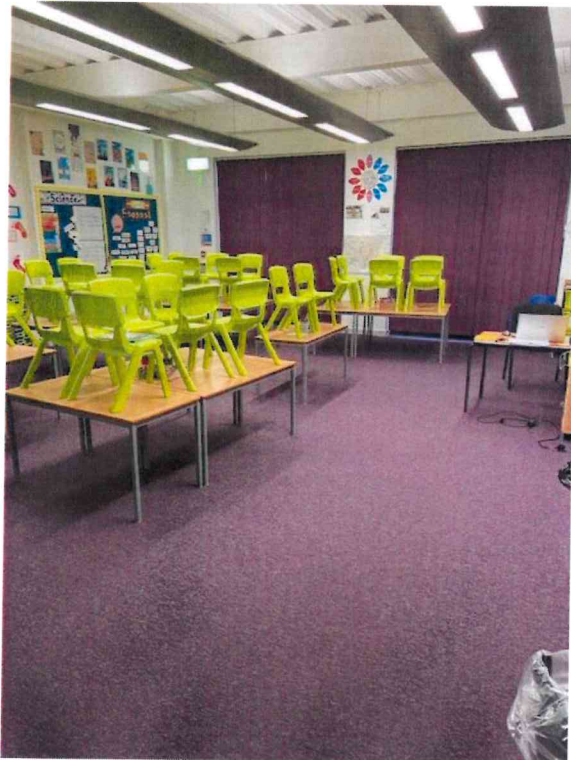

This is the year 3 classroom.



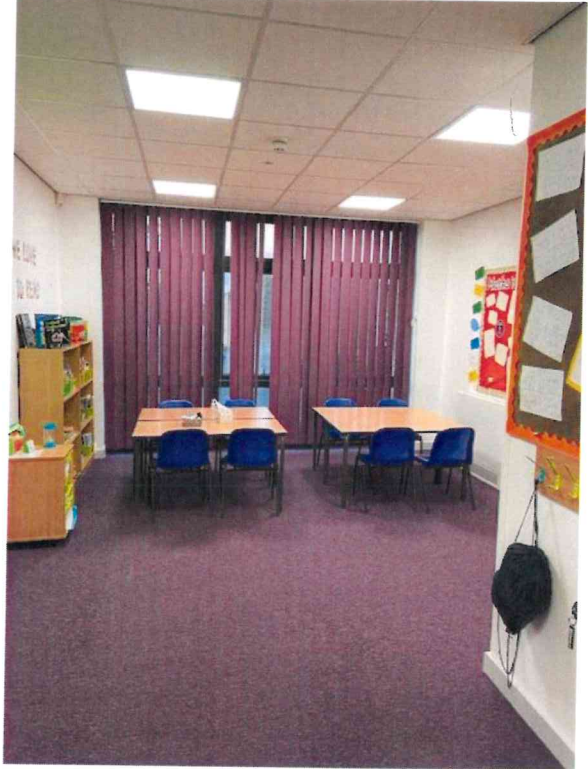

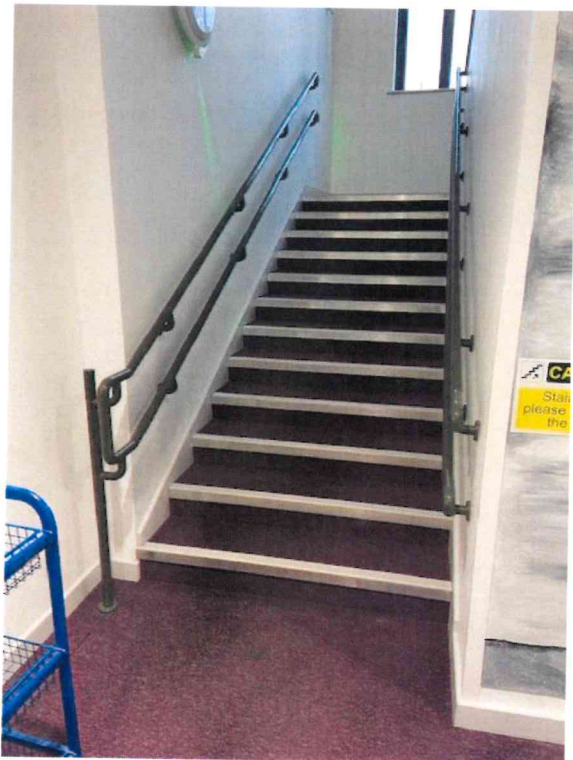

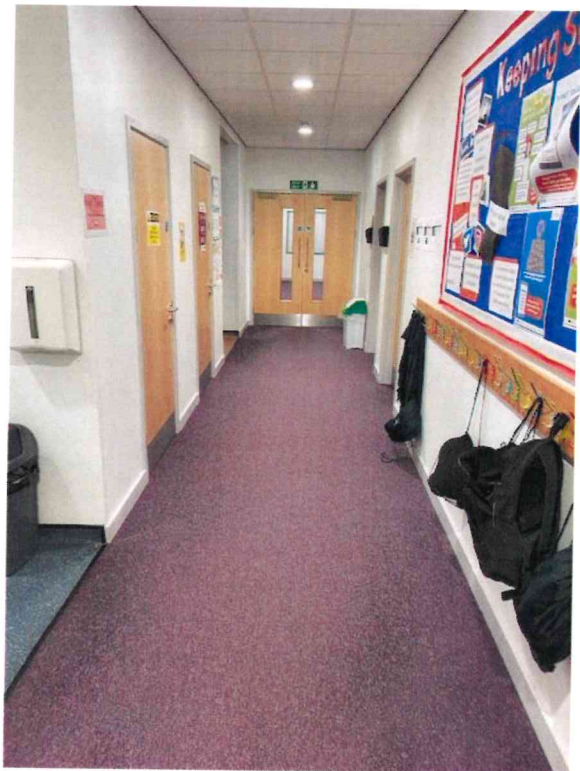

**Afternoon session:** 12.45pm-3.15pm (EYFS/ KS1)

*The children are admitted into school from 8.40am and must be in class by 8.50am. This gives them the opportunity to settle in class before registration. We ask that parents do not bring the children in before 8.40am as this is teacher preparation time. The register will close at 9am therefore children who arrive after need to report to the school office and sign in and will be marked in the register accordingly.*

*Children will leave classes at 3.15pm. We ask parents to wait by the classroom doors in KS1 and in the playground for KS2. This will assist us in ensuring all children are safely collected.*
